

Women of the Holocaust and Holocaust Education Educator Workshop

Dr. Miriam Klein Kassenoff will be presenting on how to integrate the Women of the Holocaust into a Holocaust Education curriculum.



Dr. Klein Kassenoff is a child survivor of the Holocaust who fled Nazi Europe with her family in 1941. She has studied at Yad Vashem and is a graduate of the prestigious Vladka Meed Teacher's Program. She is the Director of the Holocaust Teachers Institute at the University of Miami where she also serves as an adjunct professor/lecturer, as well as the Education Specialist for Holocaust Studies for Miami-Dade County Public School. She is a frequent speaker on Holocaust education nationwide and co-authored *Studying the Holocaust Through Film and Literature*. Dr. Klein Kassenoff is the founder of the "Screening the Holocaust" film series in Miami. She has been awarded Professional Educator of the Year by the Miami-Dade Social Studies Organization, the Tikkun Olam Award from the Haitian Holocaust Refugee Project, and was given a special tribute by the Florida House of Representatives for her work on behalf of the Jewish community of Florida. She has since become one of the leading voices in Holocaust Education in the U.S.
